



Dear Friends,

It is with great pleasure that Intown Presbyterian Church thanks you for your generous support of our Uganda Construction Project during the past 8 months. Your help has contributed to a significant improvement in the stability of facilities and income for the Twongyeirwe family as well as assisting the ministry of Proclamation Task. We also wish to thank PT-USA for helping Intown in this project by communicating this opportunity to pray for and support PT. By this letter we also convey the gratitude of Julius and Grace and their family. However, our highest gratitude is to our ever faithful God who not only moved hearts to provide funds, but also provided and cared for Josh Dupuis who donated his time on this project.

At present, the duplex has been completed and God has graciously provided reliable renters. The PT office has been essentially completed and should be fully ready for occupancy in the next few weeks. The work that remains includes upgrades on the Twongyeirwe home (interior doors, cupboards and fixtures) and some foundation repairs. Also a driveway built of pavers is yet to be accomplished to deal with the axel-deep mud during the rainy season. The funds needed to complete this remaining work are estimated at about \$6,000 and we are in prayer that this will be provided before the end of the year when the Uganda Construction Project fund will be closed. At that time a full report will be prepared, including photos. It will be shared with Julius and the PT Board of Directors in Uganda and sent to PT-USA for posting on the PT website (www.proctask.org). In the meantime, if you desire further information or a presentation on the details of the work, please feel free to contact the Intown office or Larry Gentry (lgentry804@aol.com) on the Intown Missions Team.

As a side note, a supporting church in the UK also funded a project to help Grace Twongyeirwe establish a "chicken and egg" business. Thanks to their help, Grace now has a large chicken coop with birds numbering nearly 1,000, including fryers, broilers and layers. The result of these two projects in 2010 is that the duplex rental income along with the commercial sale of chickens and eggs is providing stabilization of family income. Completion of the PT office has reduced PT costs as well as making for greater efficiencies in Julius' ministry among the pastors and churches in Uganda.

May our faithful Lord richly bless you for your support of PT and please join us in prayer for this work. Tax receipts for your contribution to this project will be sent from Intown after the year-end.
